Introduction

- Our lives are full of choices and decisions
- What defines us a Human Beings not Robots
- God planted in each of us His Image
 - Genesis 1:27 So God created mankind in his own image. . .
- Making decisions is actually a "God-like" quality

Problem

- We have inherited a sinful/fallen nature.
 - We are not capable of always making good, wise decisions.
- Sometimes, our decisions are motivated by greed, envy, lust, selfishness.
- Sometimes our decisions simply lack godly wisdom.

Solution

- We must seek God's wisdom to make good decisions
 - From His Word, His Spirit, His People
 - If any lack wisdom..., ask God (James 1:6)

- 2 Decision-making contexts:
 - Micro Context seconds, minutes, hours, etc.
 - Macro Context months, years, seasons of life, etc.

Micro Context - Decisions about time


Key Point #1


- When it comes to decisions about what to do with our time, we should not forget the priority of things that are IMPORTNT but NOT URGENT.
- These are the things in the long run that are going to make the biggest impact on our lives and how we serve the Kingdom of God.


Macro Context – Decisions about life plans


Proverbs 16:3


Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and your plans will succeed.











Key Point #2

- When it comes to decisions about life plans, be <u>RESPONSIBLE</u> and intentional about making decisions, but hold your plans <u>HUMBLY</u> as you listen for God's Spirit to confirm or correct your decisions so that they ultimately accomplish His purposes.
- This is how to avoid anxiety and maintain a sense of peace and contentment in decision-making.
